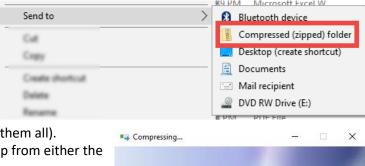
Windows 10: ZIP (file compression) is built into Windows

Good-bye WinZip and other third-party compression programs – that feature is built right into Windows 10.

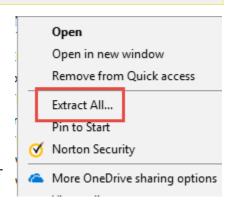
1. Open File Explorer (either by pressing 🕮 E (brownie points for using this keyboard shortcut) – or by clicking the

FILE EXPLORER icon down on the taskbar at the bottom of the screen.

- 2. Select the files, or folders, that you want to zip.
- 3. RIGHT-CLICK one of the selected files or folders and choose SEND TO.
- 4. Then choose COMPRESSED (ZIPPED) FOLDER.
- 5. You will see the progress bar flash by with the names of the files it is compressing (too fast to see them all).
- 6. Then you will see a new folder in your list made up from either the name of one of the folder(s) you compressed
- 7. The new folder is automatically left in rename mode (highlighted) so that you can type a more appropriate name if you want or just press [ENTER] to keep existing name.
- 8. You can ADD MORE FILES to the zip folder by simply dragging and dropping the files onto the folder. (Just click ADD when the ADD window appears).
- 9. To EXTRACT *all* the files:
 - a. RIGHT-CLICK the zipped folder then click EXTRACT ALL.
 - At the EXTRACT COMPRESSED (ZIPPED) FOLDERS window –
 BROWSE to the folder where you want to extract the files to and click SELECT FOLDER button.
 - c. Then click EXTRACT button. The files will be extracted to the selected location.
 - d. **Warning**: if you have WinZip installed, you will not see the EXTRACT ALL option; instead you'll see OPEN WITH WINZIP.
- 10. To EXTRACT some of the files:
 - a. DOUBLE-CLICK the zipped folder to open it up.
 - b. Drag or copy the desired files.
